

Since we have been looking at the subject of joy in Philippians during our Sunday evening messages, I was blessed by this little devotion given by Dr. Bruce Barnes in his weekly "Barnes on the Bay" newsletter. I hope it will be a blessing to you.

The Joy of Repentance

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." — Psalm 51:10

Repentance, joyful? Yes, when we understand its result. Repentance is often seen as sorrowful, a significant moment of acknowledging sin before a holy God. Yet, within this act of humility lies an unexpected gift—joy. True repentance is undoubtedly about turning away from sin, but it also involves turning toward God, who restores, renews, regenerates, and revives our hearts. And who would not want that?

David deeply understood this when he cried out in Psalm 51 after committing grievous sins. In his prayer, he didn't merely ask for forgiveness; he longed for a clean heart and a steadfast spirit. He recognized that sin separates us from God, while repentance brings restoration. It is encouraging to know that when we genuinely seek the Lord's mercy, He does not turn us away. Instead, He graciously cleanses us, making us whiter than snow (Psalm 51:7).

The joy of repentance springs from the certainty that God welcomes us back with open arms. Just as the father in the parable of the prodigal son ran to embrace his wayward child, our Heavenly Father rushes to meet us, covering us with His love and restoring our place in His family (Luke 15:20-24). Sin weighs heavily on the soul, pressing down with guilt and sorrow. However, true repentance lifts that burden, sweeping away despair and filling the heart with peace and joy.

The joy of repentance is always within reach for those who surrender, offering not merely a second chance but a transformed life. Through God's amazing work of grace, He changes us from the inside out, granting us a new heart that yearns for Him above all else. This isn't just a fresh start; it's a work of the Holy Spirit, reshaping us to walk in righteousness. True repentance offers more than forgiveness—it leads to freedom.

If your heart feels heavy today, bring it to the Lord. Confess, turn away from sin, and embrace the joy that comes with being made new. Let repentance be not a burden but a gateway to deeper fellowship with the One who loves you the most.

Our Prayer: "Father, cleanse my heart and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Help me to walk in joyful repentance, knowing Your mercy is greater than my sin. Thank You for restoring me and drawing me closer to You. Amen.

- Please pray for Israel



Lifted is a TWR documentary film following the ministry of the Schoen family in Suriname. They are one of several families that ventured deep into the jungles of the Amazon to spread God's Word to unreached tribes. I get to support Tom Schoen in his continuing efforts to disciple believers along lands bordering Brazil. Ted and Roy also served there and continue to make trips to see their Wayana and Trio friends and impart some Christian kindness to them. Soon, Josh will join the work with his engineering skills. Today the story continues as the tribal elders are building two AM transmitters to minister to their people along the river.
